

***Wuthering Heights* (1847): Chapter Breakdown**

1. 1801. The diary of Mr Lockwood, new tenant of Thrushcross Grange. Lockwood's disturbing account of his first visit to his landlord, Mr Heathcliff, master of Wuthering Heights.
2. Lockwood determines upon a second visit, but is bewildered by the eccentric inhabitants of Wuthering Heights, and unable to 'read' the network of relationships within or the landscape without. Forced to stay the night at the Heights.
3. Lockwood's night in the panelled bed. Reads Catherine Earnshaw's diary and believes himself haunted by her ghost. His cries heard by Heathcliff who takes his place in the panelled bed for the rest of the night. Guided back to Thrushcross Grange in the morning.
4. Housekeeper Nelly Dean entertains Lockwood by recounting Heathcliff's history and the origins of Hindley Earnshaw's oppression of Heathcliff.
5. The origins of Catherine Earnshaw's friendship with Heathcliff ('much too fond'). Death of Mr Earnshaw.
